INFORMATION SYSTEMS

Phishing doesn't just happen over email - The Privacy Commissioner of Canada recently issued a warning about a growing number of people receiving phone calls from fraudsters claiming to be from a government department, with a warning that their SIN has been compromised. An air of legitimacy is added to these calls since the calling number has been masked to appear as if it were actually from a government phone number.

Remember to never provide personal information such as a SIN, credit card or banking account numbers unless you have initiated the call yourself, and to a verified phone number.

As of 2020 UWO Reservations will be switching to a new reservations system that will require users to login using their @<u>uwo.ca</u> email addresses to submit requests. This will not work with generic accounts (such as @<u>westernusc.ca</u>), it will need to be from each person's personal @<u>uwo.ca</u> account since the new system will authenticate via Western's login servers.
